

Division 5 and 6 Embark on a Journey of Truth and Reconciliation

It was a warm, bright fall day when Division 5 and 6 disembarked from the school on a walk to the Tseshaht Longhouse in preparation for National Day of Truth and Reconciliation.

The journey was marked by an awareness of our commitment to listen with respect in order to learn about the truth of residential schools in Canada and their profound impact on Indigenous peoples. At the Longhouse, we were warmly welcomed by local elder Nan Anne, who generously shared her personal experiences with the Alberni Indian Residential School. She also provided valuable insights into the history and enduring legacy of these institutions on the local First Nations peoples.

It was an impactful day of learning for our students, who engaged with respect and empathy. As we remember our commitment to reconciliation in Canada, this field trip served as a powerful reminder of the importance of understanding and unity in our shared journey toward healing.
